

The Wirral Way runs through Wirral Country Park and follows the line of the old Hooton-West Kirby railway creating a 12-mile route for walkers, cyclists and horseriders. The route crosses Hadlow Road just on the edge of Willaston village. The station buildings at Hadlow Road have been restored to show how they looked in the 1950's and are open to visitors.


Willaston is an attractive village situated in the heart of the Wirral countryside, midway between Neston and Ellesmere Port. The history of the village shows it has been an important agricultural settlement for over a thousand years. Traces of its importance as a farming community can be seen in the buildings around the village green which include several former farmhouses.

The village has a good range of shops and facilities for visitors and residents. There is an extensive network of footpaths and bridleways around the village, including the Wirral Way (a trail along a former railway for cyclists, walkers and horseriders).

This leaflet also includes two suggested routes for short walks around the village which take in many of the buildings of interest in Willaston.

#### Walk 1

Distance: 1 mile (20 mins). Start/Finish: Village Green.

Route: Hadlow Road, Wirral Way, footpath to Smithy Lane, Hadlow Road Points of interest: Old Red Lion, Memorial Hall, Corner House Farm, Ash Tree Farm, Rose Farm, Hadlow Road Station, Old Hall.

### — Walk 2

Distance: 1.3 miles (30 mins). Start/Finish: Christ Church, Willaston

Route: Christ Church, footpath by Churchyard, recreation ground, footpath,

Mill Lane, Christ Church.

Points of interest: Christ Church, Laburnum Farm, The Mill, Nags Head, Pear Tree Farm.
