

NESTON TOWN COUNCIL CODE OF CONDUCT FOR ALL ALLOTMENT HOLDERS

- Each allotment site is a community and all tenants should help and support others where possible to maximise the enjoyment of allotment gardening.
- Where it is a lockable site, allotment holders are responsible for ensuring that the gate is locked if they are the last person leaving in order to prevent unauthorised persons gaining access to the site.
- The allotment holder must accompany all visitors and children on site and be responsible for them at all times.
- Dogs brought onto the allotment must be kept on a lead at all times.
- Allotment holders must not deposit any rubbish/materials on any vacant plots or the plots of other tenants.
- Allotment holders must not enter any vacant plots without the prior permission of Town Council officers.
- Allotment holders must not remove any materials or crops from any vacant plots without the prior permission of Town Council officers.
- Allotment holders must only enter another tenant's plot by invitation or with the prior permission of the tenant.
- Allotment holders must not remove any materials or crops from another tenant's plot without their permission.
- Cars and trailers must not be parked on site. The only exception being for loading or unloading and then cars/trailers must be removed immediately afterwards. Cars and trailers must not block the footpath or access to other plots for any prolonged period of time and they are prohibited from being stored on site overnight.
- Allotment holders must not light any bonfires or light any fires in incinerators.
- Allotment holders and authorised visitors must respect other allotment holders' privacy and their right to peace and quiet whilst on their plots.
- Allotment holders must work together with their neighbouring tenants in a spirit of co-operation to maintain the access paths around and between their plots.
- Allotment holders who have a grievance or wish to report any other allotment holder who is in violation of their allotment tenancy should contact a Neston Town Council officer.
