	Little Neston Telephone Kiosks: Consultation with Local Residents		CE7/67

The Town Council will need to begin a process of consultation with residents living in the immediate vicinity of the two telephone kiosks that have been removed for refurbishment.

Following on from earlier committee discussions, it is recommended that both consultations include a suggested use and ask for views and any possible alternatives.

Rayburn Avenue/Landseer Avenue

For the kiosk on the corner of Rayburn Avenue/Landseer Avenue, it has been suggested that this would be a suitable location for a defibrillator. The cost to purchase a defibrillator and heated external cabinet is currently in the region of £1,500. There will also be the cost to install a new electricity supply and the ongoing cost of electricity bills.

The Green (Opposite Royal Oak)

Local Brownie/Guide leaders have indicated that they would like to use the kiosk as a children's book swap box. The transom wording could read "Community Box" which would allow for a variety of alternative uses in future years. A solar-powered light could be used for this kiosk to avoid having to install an electricity supply.
